Reader: Amen. Glory to Thee, our God, glory to Thee.

O Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth, Who art everywhere present and fillest all things, Treasury of good things and Giver of life: Come and dwell in us, and cleanse us of all impurity, and save our souls, O Good One.

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us. (Thrice)

Psalm 50

Have mercy on me, O God, according to Thy great mercy; and according to the multitude of Thy compassions blot out my transgression. Wash me thoroughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know mine iniquity, and my sin is ever before me. Against Thee only have I sinned and done this evil before Thee, that Thou mightest be justified in Thy words, and prevail when Thou art judged. For behold, I was conceived in iniquities, and in sins did my mother bear me. For behold, Thou hast loved truth; the hidden and secret things of Thy wisdom hast Thou made manifest unto me. Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord! How can we not marvel at the almighty divinity of Christ, Who through His sufferings sheddeth dispassion and incorruption upon all the faithful, and poureth forth a well-spring of immortality from His holy side and life everlasting from His tomb?

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord!

The magnificent angel hath now appeared to the women, bearing splendid tokens of natural and immaterial purity, by his appearance proclaiming the light of the resurrection, crying: The Lord is risen!

Refrain: O Most Holy Theotokos, save us!

All-glorious things have been said of thee among generations of generations, O thou who contained God the Word in thy womb, remaining pure, O Mary Theotokos; wherefore, we all honor thee, our help after God.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Speaking words of life and giving instruction concerning that which is divine, Christ said to his friends: "Recognize the Father in Me, for I emit unapproachable light, unto the joy of those who chant: Let us sing unto our God, for He hath been glorified!"

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

"Ye will be invested with the power of tongues, O My friends and disciples, and will be marvellous in the richness thereof, for ye will be filled with glory. For I shall reveal Myself to be brighter than the sun, illumining those who chant in joy: Let us sing unto our God, for He hath been glorified!"

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Shining forth today with divine radiance on Mount Tabor, as He promised, Christ hath laid bare His countenance to His disciples. And, full of light-bearing and divine splendor, they chanted in joy: Let us sing unto our God, for He hath been glorified!

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us! O Matthias, bestow thou a beam of salvation from heaven upon me who now hymn thy radiant festival with hymns, I pray.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us!

Thou hast been revealed to be a great sun of the great Light, O right wondrous one; for thou hast conversed directly with God Who is with us, O apostle.

Refrain: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Submitting to the laws of the Master, O blessed one, with the net of thy tongue thou didst draw forth the ends of the earth from the abyss of ignorance.

Refrain: Both now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen! In His goodness, the supremely divine Word saveth all of me, for He desired to become incarnate of thy womb, O pure Mother of God.

Ode III

Canon of the Resurrection

Irmos: O Christ, Who in the beginning established the heavens in wisdom / and founded the earth upon the waters, / make me steadfast upon the rock of Thy commandments; / for none is holy as Thee, // O Thou Who lovest mankind.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord! Adam, who was condemned by his sinful tasting, didst Thou justify by the saving suffering of Thy flesh, O Christ; for Thou Thyself wast not subject to the trial of death, O Sinless One.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord! Jesus my God, the Light of the resurrection, shone forth upon those sitting in darkness and the shadow of death, and binding the mighty one with His divinity, He despoiled his vessels.

Refrain: O Most Holy Theotokos, save us!

O Theotokos, thou hast been shown to be more exalted than the cherubim and seraphim; for thou alone didst receive the uncontainable God in thy womb, O undefiled one. Wherefore, all of us, the faithful, bless thee with hymns, O pure one.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Having put on all of Adam and transformed the nature which of old had become dark, Thou didst illumine it with the transformation of Thine appearance and didst render it divine, O Christ.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Christ, Who of old guided Israel in the wilderness by the pillar of fire and the cloud, hath ineffably shone forth in light today on Mount Tabor.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us! Strengthened by the hand of the Author of life, O wise one, thou wast able to snatch away the spoils of the mighty one and enslave him by grace.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us! Loving the Teacher and serving Him industriously, O right wondrous one, thou dost save us from deception.

Refrain: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. The all-accomplishing Spirit chose thee, O divinely eloquent one, to fill the twelfth place in the holy choir of the disciples.

Refrain: Both now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen! Possessing thine aid, O pure one, I fear not the assaults of wicked enemies; for having thee as an intercessor, I vanquish the hordes thereof.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. Thrice

Senior Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

Kontakion

Tone 7: On the mount Thou wast transfigured, / and Thy disciples, as much as they could bear, beheld Thy glory, O Christ God; / so that when they should see Thee crucified, / they would know thy passion to be willing, / and would preach to the world // that Thou, in truth, art the Effulgence of the Father.

Ikos: Arise, ye slothful thoughts of my soul, which have ever been dragged down to the earth! Be ye upborne and rise aloft to the summit of divine ascent! Let us make haste to Peter and the sons of Zebedee, and with them let us go to Mount Tabor, that we may see the glory of our God with them, and may hear the voice which they heard from on high; and they preached that Thou, in truth, art the Effulgence of the Father.

Kontakion of the apostle, in Tone IV:

Thy luminous sound which hath gone forth like the sun into all the earth * doth enlighten the Church of the nations with grace, ** O wondrous Apostle Matthias.

Ikos: Grant me a stream of discourse, O Lord Who created the nature of water; strengthen my heart, O Compassionate One Who established the earth by Thy word; and enlighten my thoughts, O Thou Who clothest Thyself in light as with a garment, that I may say and chant fitting things worthily to honor Thine Apostle Matthias, O greatly Merciful One.

Sessional Hymn of the apostle, in Tone VIII: With the lightning-flashes of thy divine words thou didst consume the deception of the wicked one and enlighten the faithful to hymn the coming in the flesh of Him Who hath dominion over all things; and thou didst emulate His divine sufferings. Wherefore, assembling, we celebrate in gladness thy holy memory and cry out to thee in unison: O Apostle Matthias, entreat Christ God, that He grant forgiveness of sins unto those who with love honor thy holy memory.

Glory ..., Both Now & ever ..., in the same tone:

The lightning hidden under the flesh of Thy nature and divine majesty, O Christ our Benefactor, didst thou show forth upon the holy mountain, shining upon the disciples who were with Thee. And when they perceived Thine unbearable glory, they cried aloud: "Holy art Thou, for, though Thou art unapproachable, Thou art visible to the world in the flesh, O Thou only Lover of mankind!"

Ode IV

Canon of the Resurrection

Irmos: Thou art my strength, O Lord, Thou art my power; /
Thou art my God, Thou art my joy, /
Who, without leaving the bosom of the Father, hast visited our lowliness. /
Wherefore, with the Prophet Habakkuk I cry unto Thee: //
Glory to Thy power, O Thou Who lovest mankind!

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord!

Thou didst love me, Thine enemy, exceedingly, for in a strange abasement Thou didst descend to earth, O Savior of loving-kindness, refusing to reject mine utter reproach; and abiding in the heights of Thine all-pure glory, Thou hast glorified that which before was dishonored.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord!

Who is not filled with awe, beholding death destroyed by Thy Passion, O Master? For by the divine power of Thee Who wast crucified was corruption put to flight by the Cross and hades emptied of its riches by Thy death. Wondrous are Thy works, O Thou Who lovest mankind!

Refrain: O Most Holy Theotokos, save us!

Thou art the boast of the faithful, O thou who knewest not wedlock, and thou art also the refuge, bulwark and haven of Christians; for thou bearest entreaties to thy Son, O most immaculate one, and savest from misfortunes those who with faith and love know thee to be the pure Theotokos.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Forming the law in writing on Sinai, O Christ God, Thou wast manifest, borne in the cloud, the fire, the darkness and the whirlwind. Glory to Thy power, O Lord!

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

That Thou mayest confirm Thy glorious dispensation, O Christ God, in that Thou hast existed from before the beginning of time, Thou didst shine forth ineffably on Tabor, likewise setting Thine ascent in a cloud.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Those who conversed with Thee as servants stood before Thee, O Master Christ; and Thou didst converse with them in the vapor of fire and darkness, and the moist whistling wind. Glory to Thy power, O Lord!

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Moses, Who of old foresaw Thee in the fire and the bush, and Elijah, who was taken up in the chariot of fire, arriving on Tabor proclaimed Thy glory, for the sake of Thy Cross, O Christ.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us! Proclaiming the one Essence of the Godhead, the one Monarchy and Dominion, O most blessed one, thou didst pursue the flock of the nations.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us! The Lord brought thee to the sea of life, O most wise one, like a horse roiling the bitter waters of polytheism.

Refrain: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. With divine discourse thou didst renew stony hearts, O glorious one, sowing piety and the knowledge of the Truth.

Refrain: Both now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen! O vessel of virginity and habitation of the infinite Being, illumine my soul, which hath been darkened by many passions.

Ode V

Canon of the Resurrection

Irmos: Wherefore hast Thou turned Thy face from me, O Light never-waning? /

And why hath a strange darkness covered me, wretch that I am? //
But turn me, and guide my steps to the <u>light</u> of Thy commandments, I pray.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord! Mocked, Thou didst deign to be clad in a purple robe before Thy sufferings, O Savior, thus covering the ugly nakedness of the first-created man; and, naked, Thou wast nailed to the Cross in the flesh, O Christ, stripping off our robe of mortality.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord! Arising, Thou didst fashion anew from the dust of death my fallen essence, O Christ, and didst render it never-aging, showing it again to be a royal image, resplendent in the life of incorruption.

Refrain: O Most Holy Theotokos, save us! Possessed of maternal boldness before thy Son, O most pure one, dismiss not the thought of us as thy kin, we pray thee; for thee alone do we Christians set before the Master, to obtain merciful purification.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

The mountains inclined themselves before Thy face; for Thou wast well pleased to accept, in Thine earthly form, the light and heavenly rays which the sun came and laid at Thy feet.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

Moses and Elijah cried to the disciples who were being instructed on holy Mount Tabor: "Behold, Christ the Savior is the God Whom we proclaimed of old!"

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

The immutable nature, having mingled itself with human nature, shone forth ineffably, abundantly disclosing to the apostles the light of the immaterial Godhead.

Glory to Thee, Our God, glory to Thee.

When the disciples beheld Thee, the ever-existent Effulgence, shining in the glory of the Father, O Christ, they cried out to Thee: "Direct Thou our paths in Thy light!"

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us!

The true Vine put thee forth as a most fertile branch producing the grapes which exude the wine of salvation; and drinking thereof, O blessed one, we who are held fast by ignorance have cast off the drunkenness of deception.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us!

Thou wast shown to fulfill the choir of the twelve disciples from which the betrayer had cast himself, finding bitter strangulation, having lifted his heel against Christ, O wondrous Matthias, proclaimer of the mysteries.

Refrain: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Thou wast cast into the world as divine salt, O blessed and all-praised Apostle Matthias, cleansing away the corruption of falsehood with sweet doctrines, driving away sickness and healing wounds of body and soul.

Refrain: Both now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen! By thy most pure birthgiving, O Virgin Bride of God, Adam shed the ugly garments of ancient mortality and clothed himself in a holy robe of truth which was in nowise polluted by the passions.

Ode VI

Canon of the Resurrection

Irmos: Cleanse me, O Savior, /
for many are my transgressions; /
and lead me up from the abyss of evils, I pray, /
for to Thee have I cried, and Thou hast hearkened unto me, //
O God of my salvation.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord!

By a tree the author of evil mightily cast me down; but, having been uplifted upon the Cross, Thou, O Christ, didst with greater might cast him down, putting him to shame; and thou didst raise up him who was fallen.

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord!

Recognizing Thee as God on Tabor, O Christ, the glorious apostles, marvelling, bowed down their knees.

Refrain: Holy apostle Matthias, pray to God for us!

Thou didst become a god by adoption, deified by divine union, receiving pristine rays of light from God, and thou hast illumined the faith and cleansed the earth of the darkness of idolatry.

Refrain: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Lo! every prophecy of the sacred prophets is contained in thee, the disciple; for thou wast an eye-witness, emulator and apostle of Him Whom thou didst proclaim of old, O Matthias, servant of God.

Refrain: Both now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen! O Virgin, we, the faithful, call thee the noetic sanctuary, the untouchable mercy-seat, the golden lamp-stand, the spiritual table bearing the Bread of life.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. Thrice

Senior Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

Kontakion, Tone 8:

Having risen from the tomb, Thou didst raise up the dead and didst resurrect Adam. /

Eve also danceth at Thy Resurrection, // and the ends of the world celebrate Thine arising from the dead, O Greatly-merciful one.

Ikos: O my long-suffering Savior, Bestower of life Who lovest mankind, Who captured the kingdoms of hades and raised up the dead, Thou didst greet the myrrh-bearing women, offering them joy instead of grief, didst proclaim signs of victory to Thine apostles, and dost enlighten creation. Wherefore, the world rejoiceth at Thine arising from the dead, O greatly Merciful One.

Canon of the Resurrection

Irmos: Once, in Babylon, the fire stood in awe of the condescension of God; / wherefore, the youths, dancing with joyous step in the furnace, as in a meadow, chanted: //

Blessed art Thou, O God of our fathers!

Refrain: Glory to Thy Holy Resurrection, O Lord!

Thy glorious abasement, the divine riches of Thy poverty, O Christ, amaze the angels who behold Thee nailed to the Cross to save those who cry out with faith: Blessed art Thou, O God of our fathers!
